

SAA STUDENT POSTER AWARD 2019: CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

The Student Poster Award Committee from the Society of American Archaeology calls for poster submissions for our annual competition. The Student Poster Award is presented to the best student poster presented in a general or organized poster session. The award is designed to promote interest and acceptance of the poster in the dissemination of archaeological research, to increase the quality of poster presentations, and to acknowledge excellence in this valuable medium.

THE PRIZE: The awardee receives \$250. The awardee(s) are also recognized by the SAA through a plaque presented during the business meeting held at the Annual Meeting, a citation in *The SAA Archaeological Record*, and acknowledgment on the awards page of the SAA Website. All co-authors will receive the award.

The submission deadline is March 10, 2019.

***Who Is Eligible to Submit Nominations or Apply for the Award:** All student members of SAA in good standing whose poster abstract has been accepted by the SAA for the upcoming annual meeting are eligible to participate. All co-authors must be students, and the first author must be a member of the SAA. All co-authors share the award.

*Nomination/Submission Materials Required: The poster abstract must be accepted by SAA for the upcoming annual meeting. All co-authors must be students, and the first author **must be a member of the SAA.** The poster must be submitted to the poster award committee chair in PDF format. The guidelines for posters can be found on the Annual Meeting page on saa.org.

The student must submit **electronic** copies in PDF form of 1) a separate page with name, poster title, and full contact information; 2) the poster. Please REMOVE YOUR NAME AND AFFILIATION FROM THE PDF of the poster you send so that your poster may be reviewed anonymously by the committee.

The student must have a faculty or supervisory sponsor review the poster before the student submits it to the Student Poster Award Committee. The faculty/supervisory sponsor must send an email to the submission address at the time of poster submission saying that he/she has read and approved the poster being submitted.
