This is the 2nd circular for the Workshop of the Working Group on Archaeological Soil Micromorphology (WASM) from **Monday 2nd to Wednesday 4th September at the University of Basel**. Due to the restricted number of microscopes, we have to limit the number of participants to 35. The rules are simple: first come, first served. In case of too many registrations, we will inform you immediately and, if required, put you on a waiting list. There will be no talks at the workshop. However, there is the possibility to present posters. We kindly ask you to provide this information when registering.

For fees and account information, please refer to the registration form. The payment should be made **before 31st May 2019** by direct bank transfer. If you transfer the money from a foreign bank, please take into account the international transaction fees charged by your bank. You have to pay the transaction fees as well, since we can only process your registration if the fee has been paid completely. We thank you for your understanding.

The workshop will take place at the **Geological Institute of the University of Basel** at the "Bernoullianum" ([Bernoullistrasse 30, Basel](#)). There are quite a lot of hotels in Basel - also around the Bernoullianum. We have had very good experiences with the [Hotel Rochat](#), which is only a few minutes away from the venue. There is also a [youth hostel](#), but it is a bit more distant (about 2 km).
