1. Learning Support Fund - uptake

Item

Concerns raised regarding the take-up of LSF, particularly in relation to London universities.

NHSBSA Action

To provide figures on which institutions/geographical areas the majority of students were from, which professions had signed up, the percentage and what the difference is from previous (bursary) numbers.

NHSBSA (LR) response

The table below shows the number of students who have claimed LSF, by university and by LSF award element by academic year since LSF was introduced in 2017¹.

2. TDAE claim form - wording

Item

Members agreed that the wording on the TDAE claim form for HEI's to sign was a challenge - i.e. cheapest form of transport etc.

Action

To be fed back to NHS Bursaries.

NHSBSA comment

The TDAE claim form has been updated for the 2019/20 academic year. A copy of this is attached for reference.

It should be noted that:

- The wording regarding 'the cheapest form of transport' is only included in the Student's declaration; HEI staff are not required to verify this when authorising the form, they are only required to confirm the costs the student has claimed have been reasonably and necessarily incurred;
- the requirement for students to use the cheapest form of transport, wherever possible, is as per Department of Health and Social Care Policy – see: www.gov.uk/government/publications/learning-support-fund-3rd-edition

3. TDAE – future methods for claiming

Item

Change to electronic TDAE claim forms due to manual forms being resource intensive for HEI's.

Action

NHSBSA to provide a timeline for when they are likely to consider moving to electronic claim forms

NHSBSA (LR) comment

We will be conducting a full end-to-end system review towards the end of 2019 and into 2020. At this stage we are unable to confirm exact dates or whether funding would be made available for a new system. However, we will keep the group updated with any developments.

4. LSF Guidance

Action

NHSBSA to confirm when the 2019/20 guidance would be published, and forward this information to ARC SAM members when received.

NHSBSA (LR) response

5. Child Dependants Allowance (CDA)

Item

2018 figures indicated that around 8000 applications for CDA were not approved.

Action

NHSBSA to confirm the reasons for this, and to provide numbers to show how many were rejected across CDA, TDAE, ESF for the 2017/18 academic year

NHSBSA response

We have expanded this to show the total numbers of rejections per allowance, per academic year from 2017 to date. The final number of CDA applications rejected in 2018 was 5,737 rather than 8,000.

Whilst the NHSBSA does not record actual reasons for rejection, the most common types could include:

- Student ineligible to claim as they do not meet the <u>general LSF eligibility</u> criteria
 - Student not on eligible programme
 - Student not eligible for tuition fee and maintenance support from Student Loans Company
 - Student not in active study at time of claim

CDA-specific

 student has not shown they have parental responsibility for one or more children or the child they are claiming for is over 15 (or over 17 if child has special educational needs) at the start of the academic year;

TDAE-specific

- amount claimed for travel to placement is not in excess of their return daily travel to university
- Accommodation costs invalid e.g. not paying for dual accommodation

ESF-specific

- Claim not authorised by university
- Incorrect or no evidence of income/expenditure included with claim form

6. Bursary extension request process

Item 1

Feedback for NHSBSA - requesting extensions to bursaries do not work well noting as there is an additional form for HEE sign off, as well as the BUR102 form for the HEI to submit. HEE sign-off could further delay the process.

NHSBSA (LR) response

Currently HEE sign-off is required due to the reduced availability of NHS Bursary funding. HEE approval should be sought prior to completion of the BUR form for all cases.

There will however be a natural end to this process as existing bursary-funded students complete training (etc). The issue has been fed back to DHSC who are looking at cut-offs for bursary extensions/repeat funding.

Item 2

Discussion took place regarding what was acceptable for a bursary extension. This varied from panel to panel or by region and there was a need for consistency.

Action – NHSBSA to share few case study examples.

NHSBSA (LR) response

The decision as to what is acceptable reason for a bursary extension is ultimately the decision of the relevant HEE office. When NHS Bursaries were first removed, HEE agreed a process/policy for what is/is not acceptable reasons for continuous bursary funding. The NHSBSA understands this was disseminated to all Regional HEE offices to ensure consistency in decision-making.

7. Future for NHSBSA at ARC SAMS

Item

Discussion took place regarding the future for NHS Bursaries at ARC SAM. The group agreed it was useful to get updates, and they should continue to be invited to future meetings. However, if they were unable to attend, it would be useful if Louisa could give the Chair some notes to enable further discussion and to drill down into some of the statistics and reasons behind them in into more detail

NHSBSA (LR) response

Louisa or representative will be happy to attend future meetings depending on the level of detail and information required for a particular meeting, and taking into account travelling time and cost due to distance.

8. NHSBSA Stakeholder Engagement

The NHSBSA continues to promote LSF and our other student funding activity as and when the appropriate opportunities arise. In 2019, we have continued our pro-active work with LSF on Tour, presenting sessions and manning information stalls to students and staff at over 20 universities to date.
