CoreTrustSeal certification of the CLARIN.dk Repository

CLARIN-DK is an infrastructure where researchers can deposit, share and download language-based material. We will share the experiences from achieving the CoreTrustSeal for the CLARIN repository, and give examples of tasks that had to be carried out during the process. 'Curation of FAIR data - Figshare beyond'

DTU's repository, DTU Data, based on the Figshare platform, has been operating for 2½ years. We now begin to see the uptake and the consequence of the implementation choices we made.

The Library RDM team are met with expectations, requests and development ideas from the researchers and we strive to accommodate the feedback with a close collaboration with the Figshare support team.

All data submitted to DTU Data are reviewed and approved before publication and with the vast growth of data submitted we have to consider outsourcing the curation. We would like to present our experience, our challenges, success stories as data curators and also our thoughts on introducing the role to department data stewards.
