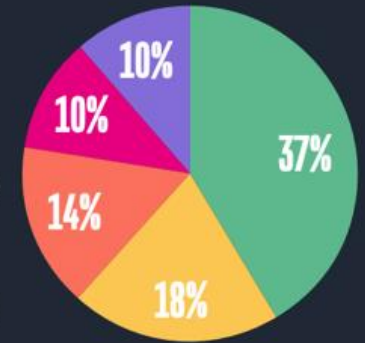

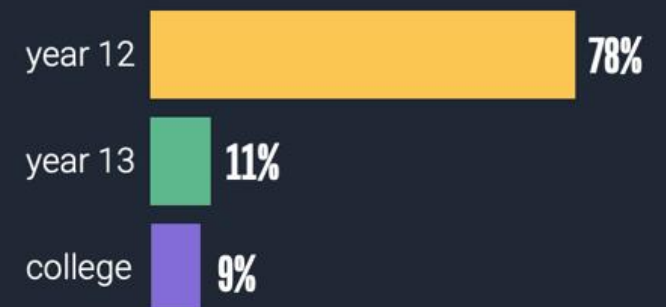

Scanning news

- Change to QR codes for scanning from 2024
- Scanning helpline launched staffed from 08:30 on event days 01242 545 725 and is included on scanning instructions
- Scanning lead file – further changes are coming for the scanning lead file in January 2024:
 - Removal of unused fields (delayed from 2023)
 - Addition of apprenticeship industries fields to lead file
 - Change to subjects that students can select (aligned with other UCAS processes/systems and reporting)
 - There is an improved turnaround for any photographs of barcodes that cannot be scanned being added to the lead files. This can be immediate rather than the previous weeks lead time in 2022.
- We are looking at how we can improve the scanning experience further. There have been quite a few requests to:
 - Be able to manually input barcodes
 - Make the licence code process easier
 - Add the school number to the lead file (which number are exhibitors expecting?)

2024 dates

- The Derby event has now moved to Nottingham (remaining a shell scheme event).
- UCAS Discovery Aberystwyth will run for the first time.
- The event at Aberdeen will be held at Robert Gordon University.
- The event at Ayrshire will be held at Ayrshire College - Kilmarnock Campus.
- The Stoke-on-Trent campus event date will be **moving from Tuesday 23 April to Thursday 13 June.**
- Exhibitors wishing to book the **Liverpool event** on Friday 14 June, **please book your hotels ASAP** as there is a Taylor Swift concert on between **Thursday 13 June - Saturday 15 June.**
- **Moray and Fife** – Service providers have not submitted hosting applications for 2024.

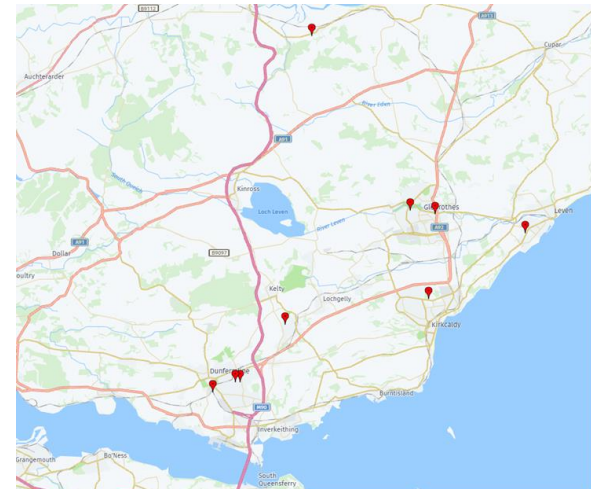


Moray:

The schools further south are approx 1 hour 15mins from Aberdeen and 1 hour 40mins from Inverness. The schools to the East of Moray are approx. 1 hour and 20mins from both events. The schools more central to Elgin are 1 hour away and the west schools around 55mins.

Fife:

6 schools are travelling via coach, 1 on public transport and 2 on foot. In terms of access to Edinburgh or Forth Valley
 The Southern Schools are 42 – 55 mins from Forth Valley, 25 – 35 minutes to Edinburgh. Central Glenrothes schools are 40 minutes to Edinburgh. The school right up north is 20 minutes from the Tayside event.
 The two schools attending on foot are the two pins on Glenrothes and are 40 minutes to Edinburgh. The school going on public transport is 35 minutes from Edinburgh.



Power and lighting

- To reduce energy consumption at UCAS events, a light will not be available at every event in 2024.
- Lighting will be provided at the following events: Sheffield, Nottingham, Newcastle, Brighton, Lisburn, Exeter, and Maidstone.
- If exhibitors wish to have a light on their stand at the events where lighting isn't provided, this can be ordered through GES Espresso Shop.
- Exhibitors will be able to register their interest for campus electrics via the Enet shop (limited availability).

Exhibitor booking timeline

- Subs booking opening Tuesday 26 September 2023, 11am
- Subs window closes Tuesday 10 October 2023, midnight
- Can edit booking during window
 - Single stands unlimited, limited number of stand upgrades, where space permits, sold on a first come first served basis. Will inform this group of any sequential draws if required. Singles only at Bournemouth and Nottingham.
 - Waiting list kept throughout, exhibitors to email account manager or eventssales@ucas.ac.uk for any stand sizes they are unable to select during booking
 - Hope to be able to get back to waiting list by end of November (majority sorted in October)
- One day priority booking on add-ons and subject spotlight stands, Tuesday 16 October 2023, 11am
 - Book before 30 November to get items at 2023 prices
- **Pay per event** opens Wednesday 17 October, 11am – first come first served

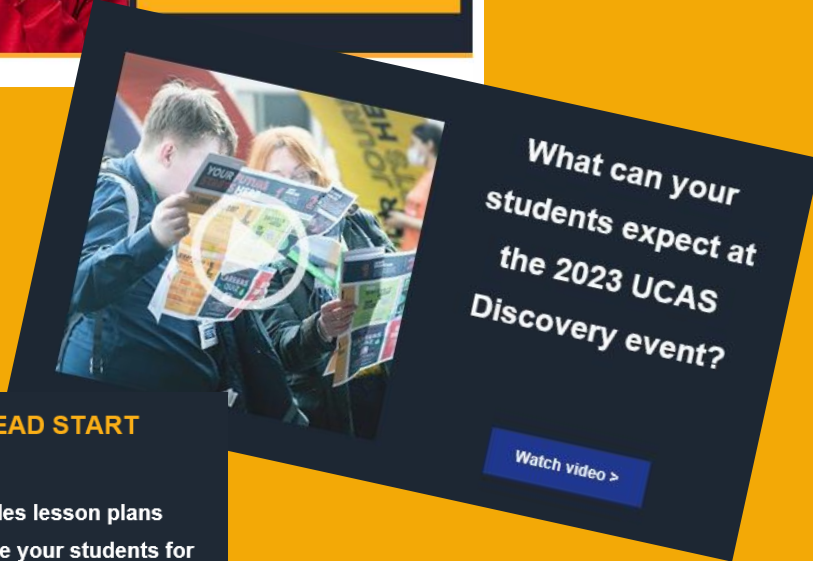
